Family Responsibilities

FA needs every family involved in helping our community reduce the spread of ALL infectious diseases.

- Please DO NOT bring your child(ren) to FA if they have symptoms of any contagious ailment. <u>Keep sick children at home</u>.
- If your child needs to stay home, please call or text your building as soon as possible.
- Train your children to cover their mouths with a tissue when they sneeze or cough and throw out the tissue immediately, or to sneeze or cough into the bends of their elbows when tissue isn't handy.
- Each Thursday morning, please run through this checklist for each child at FA:
 - Temperature over 100.4
 - Sore throat
 - o Uncontrolled cough with difficulty breathing
 - o Had close contact with someone diagnosed with COVID 19
 - If you can answer yes to any of these, please keep your child home until your child is symptom-free.

Child Responsibilities

FA will encourage all children to engage in health-promoting behaviors that prevent many illnesses:

- Wash hands for at least 20 seconds and frequently.
- Don't share food or drinks.
- Give elbow bumps instead of handshakes or hugs.
- Wipe down tables regularly.

Programming Changes

First Addition is a Christian, non-profit organization that partners with homeschooling families to provide support and encouragement for both parents and their homeschooled students.  - Washing/sanitizing hands
 - Not sharing food
 - o Breaks outside

Staff/Board Responsibilities

FA will create as many policies as is reasonable to help prevent the spread of disease:

- FA administrators will control access to the building. All entrances will be locked once worship has begun.
- Where possible, FA will increase ventilation by opening windows and/or doors.
- All children will have plenty of outside play.

Medical Actions

FA will isolate and send home anyone with **any** symptoms of illness.

If your child is diagnosed with COVID-19 through testing, the health department will reach out to FA. If we are contacted, we are mandated by law to report to them the names of students and teachers they have had *direct* contact with.

Mental Health Actions

Our staff has always been committed to letting you know if we see any sign that your child is struggling in any way, including their response to this pandemic. We have an open door policy with our students and our board staff if they need to talk or pray. We will make suggestions for further help as needed.
